



JOTI For Cubs

Here are some activities for Cub Scouts to explore JOTI

Internet Safety

Help Cubs have a basic understanding of internet safety. Help them to understand what is safe and unsafe to share online, why it is necessary to have a strong password and how to spot dangers while online and who to tell it to

Start with a game (Safe and unsafe information to share online)

Label corners of the room: Tell an adult, Block, Share, Keep Private. Read scenarios and the Cubs run to the action they would take. Discuss the choices.

Split into sixes and have 3 bases

1st base: passwords

In pairs, Cubs build funny and strong passwords using word, number, and symbol cards. Compare funny but safe examples. Teach: passwords should be long, unusual, and secret.

2nd base: What to do

In pairs, Cubs act out online situations. Get the others to say if it is safe or unsafe and why. Examples: A friend asks to play a game. A stranger asks where you live. Someone sends you a rude message. After each one discuss what a safe response would be

3rd base: Design a poster

Cubs make posters with their "Top 3 Tips for Staying Safe Online." Have sheets with some information on online safety and get them to use what they learnt from the meeting. Share with their sixes
