- k. Colour Coding of Extinguishers
- l. Fire Extinguisher Functions, Use and Precautions
- m. Awareness of Scouting Irelands fire safety policy
- n. Evacuation drills and training
- o. Fire Register implementation training

It also contains the Den Opening Checklist (page 18) and refers to the [Fire Safety Register](#) which should be maintained to ensure compliance with the Guidelines.
